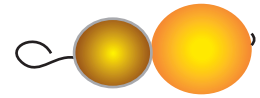
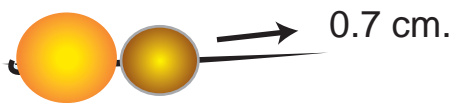


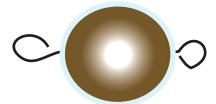
## TIP-PAGE



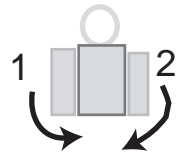
- **HEADPIN:** when the bead is placed on the headpin, cut the pin down to about 0.7 cm above the bead. Bend an eye with the round nose pliers, so this pin can be hanged on something.



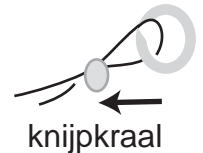
- **EYEPIN:** use exactly the same instructions as the headpin, but this pin already has an eye on one side. The eye pin is used as a connector instead of a pendant.



- **CORD CRIMP:** place the lace/cord (or other materials) in the crimp. Squeeze one side gently with the flat nose pliers. Then close the other side, so this site will overlap nicely the other site.



- **CRIMP BEAD:** when the bead is stringed on the wire twice (through and back), it can be squeezed tightly with the flat nose pliers.



- **HASULITH GLUE:** This glue can be used for all kinds of materials.

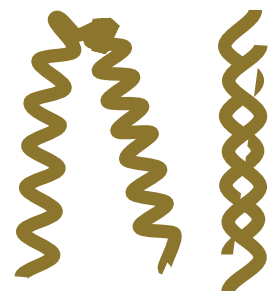


- **STRASS GLUE:** this glue is mainly used for rhinestones on metallic, glass or synthetic material. It's very handy to use the end of an headpin or a paperclip to spread the glue on the object.



- **TO TURN LACES:** use 2 equal sizes of laces. Turn the first one firmly around the clock and pinch it with a clip or on the table with your finger.

Then turn around the second lace the same way. Now turn around both laces together against the clock.



- **CORD:** when the cord becomes flocky during the stringing, you can cut off a little piece. Or you may use some nail polisher, let it dry well so the end will become hard. An other possibility is to wrap a little piece of tape at the end.



- **TO OPEN RING:** to open a ring use a flat nose pliers and a round nose pliers. Push the left side to the back and pull the right side to the front. Close it the other way around.
